Cost to Become an Eagle Member During November 2019

During November & December, the Aerie & Auxiliary are waiving enrollment fees. The new or re-enrolled applicant only needs to pay the membership dues to May 2020, or May 2021.

Cost to join during November:

Aerie -	\$18.00 to May 2020
	\$54.00 to May 2021
Auxiliary -	\$12.50 to May 2020
	\$37.50 to May 2021

After that, Aerie Dues are \$36 a year. Auxiliary Dues are \$25 per year.

An application must be submitted for all new or re-enrolled applicants.

Veterans, Law Enforcement, EMTs, Firefighters, etc., receive their first year's membership free. We ask that these new members pay a prorated monthly fee to reach May 2020, since all membership cards must now expire May 31st. For an Aerie member that would be \$18.00, Auxiliary \$12.50. This will get their membership to 31 May 2021.






HOLIDAY DECORATING: If you have been to the club over the holiday season in the past you've noticed how beautifully it has been decorated. Well it is that time again and we need your help!

I met friends, learned my way around the Aerie, worked hard and felt great! I finally felt "a part of" something and knew I was directly helping people.


